Recording Secretary: Fawn Accettura

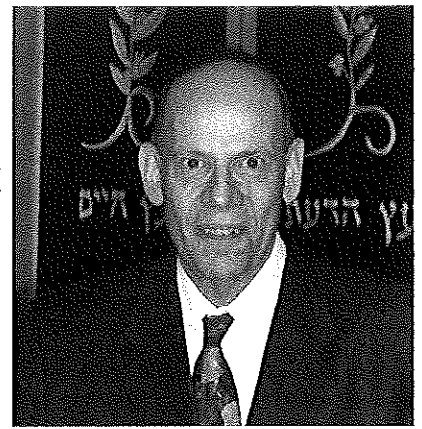
We are still in need of someone to step into the vice president's role. If you have been a board member and would like to take this position please contact Amy Solomon as soon as possible.

FROM OUR RABBI

I have had frequent contacts with members of our congregation at various times and in a variety of places, and I want to tell you that, a few times, the talk turned to the multiple roles of the rabbi and how difficult it was for a rabbi to fulfill everyone's expectations of him. What is interesting to note is that most people believe that it is a "one-way-street", that is, only members of the congregation have the right to make demands of the rabbi, but the members are not required to relate to the rabbi's hopes and dreams. Nevertheless, if there are among you this evening some who would wish to share in some of the rabbi's most personal thoughts concerning his own expectations of the congregation, here they are:



What the rabbi really wants to have is Jews. He wants people whose lives are rooted in convictions, to whom our heritage is precious, to whom God is a reality, to whom holiness is a goal, to whom Shabbat is a joy, to whom compassion is a standard, to whom the best possible Jewish education is a necessity, to whom Judaism is a way of living and way of thinking for themselves and for their children.

What a rabbi really wants is to have a synagogue that is worthy of its name, that is both physically impressive and spiritually inspiring, that has in it not only fine furnishings and good architecture, but also the presence of God and the sound of Torah, and the spirit of friendship. It must be a place that faces up to the issues of our time and which is related to all that has gone before. It must be a place in which love and devotion are invested, as well as dollars, a place in which friendships are deepened and people have matured, in which joy and strength and solace and direction can be obtained.

What a rabbi really wants to have are open minds and open hearts that will respond to him and to the Torah. He does not need to have mindless followers who will agree with whatever he says, but he needs people who know how to disagree in love and how to give and take criticism with kindness. He wants to be with his people in their time of joy and in their time of trouble so that he can help them find the Divine element in both. The rabbi needs many things in order to be happy; like all human beings, he needs health, enjoyment and good home life; but most of all, he needs to be needed.

What a rabbi really wants to have are people who will understand that he is not superman, and that he is not a devil, but that he tries as hard as he can to make a difference in the life of the congregation and the community. He wants people who will realize that he cannot pray for them or study for them, or do anything for them, but that he can do a great many things with them.

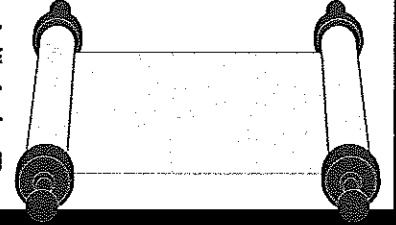
What a rabbi really wants is to be able to stand up before God at the end of his days and say: "Lord of the universe, these are the Jews whom you have entrusted to me. They are good people. They are loyal to Your Torah. They keep Your commandments. They live by Your light. They are just and kind and good, and I love them."

That's just in case you wanted to know.

Rabbi Laxmeter's Weekly Shabbat-O-Gram Messages

Dear Congregants,

I have been visiting St. Luke's Hospital twice each week. On December 1st, the hospital changed its position on clergy visitations. They have removed the Clergy Listings (where I was able to view the names of all Jewish patients and visit them all), so clergy can no longer view those lists. They have also revoked the Identification Badges of all clergy, which has further limited access to patients.

Until this situation at the hospital is resolved (and it is being worked on by the Greater Newburgh Ministerial Association, of which I am a member), I must request of you that if you, or any other member of your family, are hospitalized, that you inform me directly (by phone: 845-787-5018; by email: rebmike@hvc.rr.com) in order for me to be able to make a hospital visit. Even if you fill out the form for the hospital, indicating your desire for clergy to be informed of your being in the hospital, the hospital does not call the synagogue or me to inform us. That task falls to you. Please keep us informed so that I can provide spiritual healing, while your doctor provides medical healing. I stand ready to be of service to you, but you must reach out to me to inform me of any and all hospitalizations. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

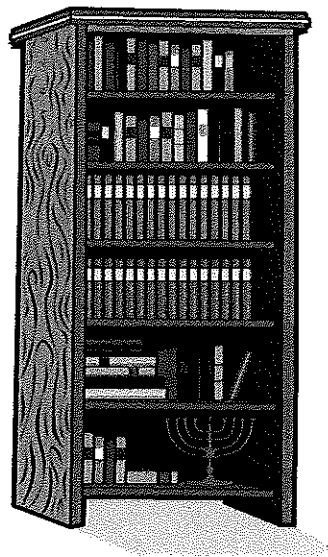

Hebrew School Happenings

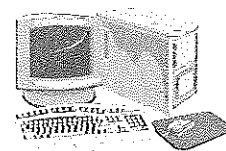
