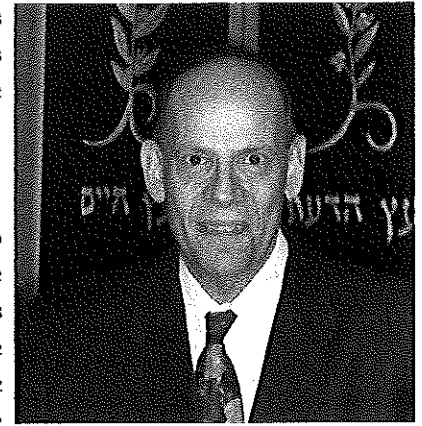

FROM OUR RABBI

According to the civil secular calendar, we have begun a new year, 2010; and as we commence this new period of time, we think about the future and its unknowns. It is because of these "unknowns" that we require some sort of religious faith that will enable us to handle successfully the challenges of the New Year.

Recently, there came to my attention a very touching story about faith:

"During a cold night in a Nazi camp, the air was broken by a brutal command to empty out all barracks. The Nazi prisoners were taken to a large field. In the middle there were two huge pits. The commander spoke harshly: 'Each one of you dogs who values his miserable life must jump over one of the pits and land on the other side.' One can imagine the terror which broke forth. Among the thousands of Jews on that field was a Hasidic rebbe and a freethinker. They had met in the camp and developed a deep friendship. The freethinker argued that it could not be done. 'Let us sit down in the pits and wait for the bullets,' he said. The rebbe, a frail man in his fifties, said, 'We are jumping.' When they opened their eyes, they both were alive on the safe side. The freethinker said, 'Rebbe, we are here, we are alive. There must be a God in heaven. Tell me, rebbe, how did you do it?' The rebbe, Rabbi Israel Spira, said, 'I held on to my ancestral merit, to the coattails of my father, grandfather and great-grandfather. Tell me, my friend, how did you reach the other side?' 'I was holding on to you,' replied the freethinker."



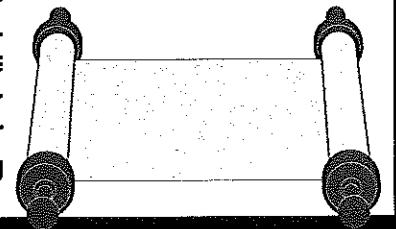

Might this not be the meaning of the verse we chant about the Torah—"It is a Tree of Life to those who hold on to it and all who uphold it are blessed."

Dear Congregants,

I have been visiting St. Luke's Hospital twice each week. On December 1st, the hospital changed its position on clergy visitations. They have removed the Clergy Listings (where I was able to view the names of all Jewish patients and visit them all), so clergy can no longer view those lists. They have also revoked the Identification Badges of all clergy, which has further limited access to patients.

Until this situation at the hospital is resolved (and it is being worked on by the Greater Newburgh Ministerial Association, of which I am a member), I must request of you that if you, or any other member of your family, are hospitalized, that you inform me directly (by phone: 845-787-5018; by email: rebmike@hvc.rr.com) in order for me to be able to make a hospital visit. Even if you fill out the form for the hospital, indicating your desire for clergy to be informed of your being in the hospital, the hospital does not call the synagogue or me to inform us. That task falls to you. Please keep us informed so that I can provide spiritual healing, while your doctor provides medical healing. I stand ready to be of service to you, but you must reach out to me to inform me of any and all hospitalizations. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Hebrew School Happenings

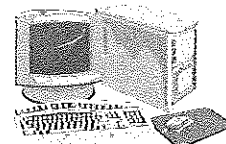

Due to so many ballots in regard to the proposed Constitution not being returned, the Committee was not able to get an accurate count on the vote. Therefore, this issue has been tabled to be resolved in a different format.

Over the past six months, the Post Office has changed their rules on bulk mailing. We are now being charged \$0.50 for every item that we send bulk mail that is returned to us. An item is returned to us if you have asked the Post Office to forward your mail or have moved. The Post Office does not forward items that are sent through bulk mail. If you move or are temporarily away, the Post Office sends us a card notifying us that they have not delivered the item and charges us \$0.50. This has become a very costly expense, therefore if we receive a notice on you, we have no choice but to stop sending ALL mail (including Yahrzeit notices) until we have been notified by you of your temporary or new permanent address. Please notify us even if you place your mail on hold for a short time. As more and more people have access to the internet and in an effort to cut costs we are deciding how we can best deliver our bulletin to your household. If you have not already provided an e-mail address to us, please do so now. Our bulletin can always be found on our website www.CongregationAgudasIsrael.org.

I am available in the Synagogue office during Hebrew School hours, Tuesday and Thursday from 4-6pm when the Hebrew School is in session. Please feel free to call me during those times.

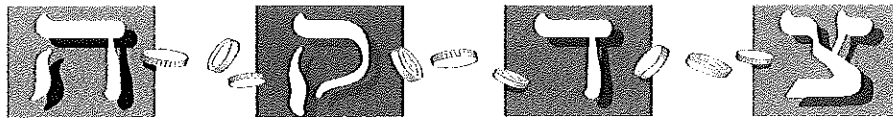

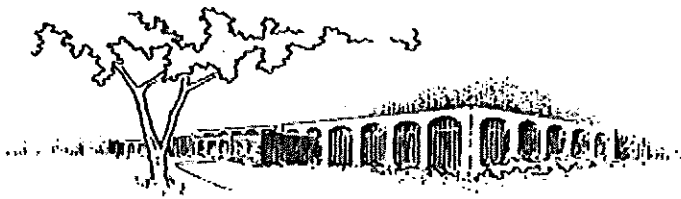
