# *A Message from your President*

As I noted last month, it will be necessary to take action this year in order to enable us to balance our budget in the years to come. I would like to thank those of you who have contacted me with ideas and/or volunteering to host an event or make a donation. As you may recall, we need to make approximately an extra \$50,000 per year beyond our normal level of income in order to remain solvent.

The following people have come forward to help us to make this extra income:

1. Lorraine Robinson has already earned approx. \$2000 by soliciting ads for our bulletin from local businesses.
2. Jack Dabrusin has pledged to hold another raffle this summer.
3. Frank Wolf has volunteered to hold a barbeque this summer.
4. Phyllis Rubnitz has volunteered to host a game night at the Shul.
5. Jonathon Kaplan has pledged to seek out new members near his home in Dutchess County.

These donations of time and leadership are extremely important to our future and I want to thank each of the volunteers.

With a \$50,000 shortfall, however, the above actions in themselves will likely not be sufficient to break even. As I mentioned last month, several families have pledged to donate "double-dues" to help reduce the deficit. I urge each of you to also consider pledging additional money to help our Shul continue to operate. This can be done privately or publicly at your discretion but please let me know personally so I can plan for it in our future budget.

We also are still in need of someone to volunteer to coordinate a Journal Dinner or Lunch this year. In the past, this program has been shown to be extremely profitable for us. I know of several people who will work on the committee for this affair if someone could just come forward to lead it.

In other news, I have started to see a resurgence in attendance on Shabbat. I counted 19 attendees last week which is about 5 more than usual. As you will recall, I put out a challenge for us to reach a regular attendance rate of 30 people. If you have not attended recently, I think you will find that the services have become much more gratifying with our present format. We are including more congregant participation for responsive readings and chanting of prayers together. In addition to his role as Gabbai, Morris Sobel has also been chanting Shacharit which adds a new dimension to the service. Additionally, Rabbi Laxmeter has been teaching our Bat Mitzvah students (Rebecca Kelson and Heidi Cowen) to chant the Musaf service which has also been an enjoyable addition to our service. Please join us.

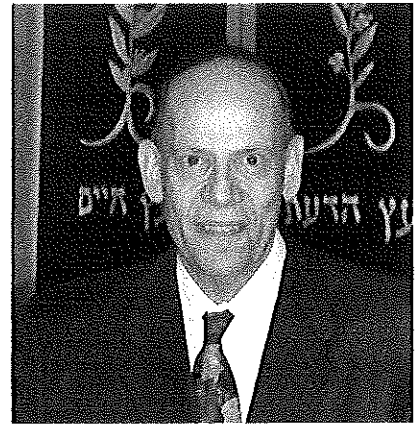

# FROM OUR RABBI

## A RECIPE FOR THE PASSOVER SEASON

Take one candle, a wooden spoon, a feather, and ten small pieces of bread. Tie them all together with a *brakhah*, and what do you have? A memorable ritual to begin the glorious Passover season. And what is the name of this glorious and memorable ritual, which all of my children and grandchildren remember with such glee as we perform it each year – *B'dikat Hametz* – the traditional Search for Leaven.



Indeed, Pesach is the festival of rituals par excellence. It is not one or two rituals, but a series of rituals which begin far in advance, long before the actual commemoration of the Yom Tov. They include games and songs, extensive preparations and structured observances. The purpose and reason behind all of these is to teach – to teach values and to inculcate loyalty and allegiance to Jewish history and ideas. Our text for this special time of the year is, of course, the Haggadah, and the Haggadah, along with the Seder, and in fact, all of the Passover holiday are meant to serve as the vehicle for teaching, for re-creating, and for reliving some very special moments in our history. Our children see these changes taking place and they sense the great anticipation of something very unique – and so, they cannot help but ask questions. The adults, who are deeply involved in the planning, work very hard and reminisce, and in so doing, become the instructors, explaining (among other things) that:

We eat *Maror* because our ancestors were slaves in Egypt; we recline because now we are free; we remove drops of wine from our full cups because we understand the meaning of suffering; we open our doors to remind ourselves that Redemption is not yet complete; we eat matzah to recall the bread that did not rise; we remove the *hametz* because things in us that ferment can destroy and defile.

The removal of *Hametz* is itself a wonderful series of rituals. First, that which cannot be finished is closeted away. Then, in a symbolic act, it is “sold” as part of a legal fiction, to a non-Jew through the use of a bill of sale which I prepare. Finally, on the night before the First Seder, after everything is cleaned and changed and readied, the family gathers to “search for the *Hametz*.” Ten pieces of bread are placed around the house (not hidden, for they must be found, and the number 10, so that one knows when the search is completed). The family then “searches” for them by the light of a candle, gathering them up with a feather and spoon so that they can be burned the next morning, declaring through an age-old formula, all remaining *Hametz* to null and void like “the dust of the earth”. This ritual, of course, can be found in the beginning of the Haggadah.

It is a simple yet quite memorable moment. I truly look forward to it each year because it symbolizes the extent of all the other preparations, because it is done by the family together. Although it is not a mystical act, it does have a certain magical quality about it. It is another step toward reliving major ideas and experiencing again the moment of the Exodus.

Rituals are sometimes funny. They take on significance in the doing. They become increasingly personal and meaningful over the years. A candle, a wooden spoon, a feather and ten pieces of bread are just very simple things. Nevertheless, they have the power of great significance for me. I think they have the same potential significance for us all.

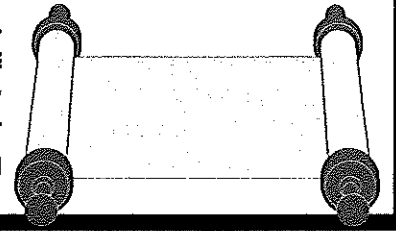

Please consider participating in the Mitzvah of *Mechirat Hametz* - the “Sale of Hametz” - which enables each of us to observe Passover from a position of not owning any Hametz - not just food items, but dishes, pots, pans and utensils as well. You can accomplish this Mitzvah by simply filing out the form for Sale of Hametz also in this issue and getting it to me by Thursday, March 25<sup>th</sup>.

Judy joins me in a prayer that this coming Festival of Freedom, Passover 5770, engender real meaning and deep joy to all the members of this congregation.

Dear Congregants,

I have been visiting St. Luke's Hospital twice each week. On December 1<sup>st</sup>, the hospital changed its position on clergy visitations. They have removed the Clergy Listings (where I was able to view the names of all Jewish patients and visit them all), so clergy can no longer view those lists. They have also revoked the Identification Badges of all clergy, which has further limited access to patients.

Until this situation at the hospital is resolved (and it is being worked on by the Greater Newburgh Ministerial Association, of which I am a member), I must request of you that if you, or any other member of your family, are hospitalized, that you inform me directly (by phone: 845-787-5018; by email: [rebmike@hvc.rr.com](mailto:rebmike@hvc.rr.com)) in order for me to be able to make a hospital visit. Even if you fill out the form for the hospital, indicating your desire for clergy to be informed of your being in the hospital, the hospital does not call the synagogue or me to inform us. That task falls to you. Please keep us informed so that I can provide spiritual healing, while your doctor provides medical healing. I stand ready to be of service to you, but you must reach out to me to inform me of any and all hospitalizations. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

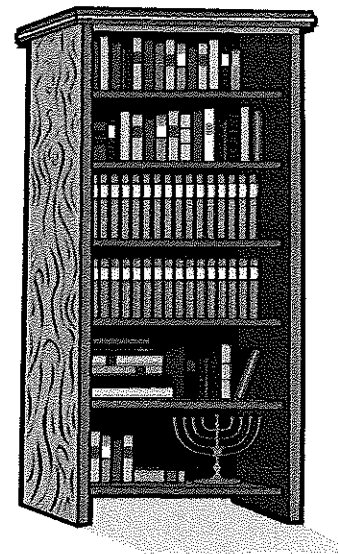

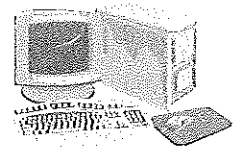

We are sincerely grateful when you choose to share your Simchas with our Congregation. We need your help to make these occasions delightful events.

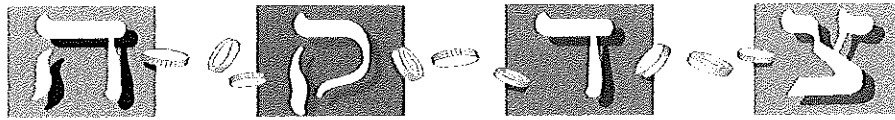
